# Foundation history:

- ♦ existing in Chrzanow for 5 years
- ♦ in 2012 the management has changed and moved to Tenczynek
- ♦ Stanislaw Michalski (born 21 Aug. 1865 in Równem, Ukraine, died 30 Dec. 1949 in Krakow)
  - adult education activist
  - issuing initiator and editor of the "Handbook for Self-Education"



# Aims:

- ♦ Popularization of research and education initiatives, (including the creation and absorption of innovation for education; and promotion of collaboration and knowledge transfer to business)
